




ADULT FAITH FORMATION OPPORTUNITIES

Este tiempo no es Cuaresma; es un tiempo de recuerdos, recogimiento y compromiso, pero también es un tiempo de esperanza durante el que, con gran alegría, la Iglesia celebra el nacimiento de Aquel invitado especial que, nacido de la Virgen en Belén, trae la justicia y la paz al mundo entero. Las lecturas del día se plasman en el ambiente que se ha presentado en el santuario. Aunque al sobrio y siempre destacando, la corona de Adviento, este ambiente no debe carecer ni de buen arte, ni de buen gusto. Es la manifestación clara de todo un ambiente de alegría que embarga los corazones cristianos. todos los signos son importantes, pero el más importante es la actitud de cada uno en su vida interior. esta actitud se nota en la espiritualidad y su disponibilidad de cambio de mentalidad, cambio de actitudes y cambio de conducta. toda la alegría del Adviento es una preparación para recibir a Jesús y darlo a conocer a los demás. Tratemos de prepararnos a través de la oración y la convivencia con los demás, especialmente practicando las obras de caridad.
